


Dorset Seal Project

 - Create photo id catalogue















Favourable conservation status at statutorily designated habitat at least partly depends on non designated habitat

Seals need an ecologically coherent network of sites

Seal not included in MCZ process, not even as a mobile marine species - they were deliberately excluded by DEFRA

We don't even know what will happen when one site in their network is removed.

Intra annual variation (1 / month)
Habitat use (Land / sea)
Inter annual variation (> 1 year)
Seal site links (photo ID)
