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












Data on bathymetry (water depth), coastlines, and geographical location underwater features: wrecks.












- Launched 2005 from MarLIN Data Access Programme (est. 1998)
- Centre of excellence for the management of marine biological data
- Accredited Data Archive Centre
- Currently hold >43 million records



- 'Free' ingestion for standard formats
- Over 2.5 million data requests per year
- Publish through NBN, ALS, GBIF, OBIS, EMODNet Biology
- Support for monitoring and reporting frameworks (inc Habitats Dir, WFD and MSFD)







- Mints DOI's for internal use and 3rd parties
- Generates standardised metadata (online tool)
- Runs MEDIN Metadata Helpdesk & workshops
- Data delivery via open source standards for 3rd party integrations
- Dedicated data discovery and download portal (plus options for customisation)



















Open Data for Open Science
