

Potential Impacts



- Disturbance change of behaviour in response to anthropogenic stimulus
- Habituation diminishing of an innate response to a frequently repeated stimulus
- Injury and Fatality

Short term – easier to observe Long term – cumulative impact



NOT ALL INTERACTIONS ARE NEGATIVE MAJORITY OF DISTURBANCE IS NOT INTENTIONAL








Seal Disturbance



Number of seals disturbed into sea 2013 - 2018






Seal Disturbance 2018



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
Cetacean disturbance incidents 2013 - 2018

- DO NOT engage during or after incident
